The Complete Level 2 Advanced Lymphoedema Management Course is a hybrid model for course delivery. It comprises of self-paced online, virtual sessions and the face to face component. This model enables the learner to have the best possible learning experience and makes sure that precious face to face time is used for fine tuning practical skills, collaborating together on problems through analysis and deconstructing it and together developing new ideas.



Self-paced Distance Learning

The self-paced distance learning component is included via the Lymphoedema Educations Solutions (LES) online management system and via the e-learning modules provided by Klose Training www.klosetraining.com. It includes readings, online presentations and activities to assist you in developing knowledge on various topics. Your prior learning will influence how much time you will need to spend on each section. There are some activities that will require you to participate in an online discussion with other course participants. The distance learning component is compulsory and will prepare you for the face to face study days. It must be completed prior to the face to face study days.



Virtual Sessions

The five virtual sessions are designed to interactively

explore various aspects of assessment and management prior to the face to face component. They are facilitated by experienced lymphoedema practitioners and delivered by experts in their fields.



Face-to-Face Master Classes

This consists of 4.5 days of master classes. These days are about developing your clinical reasoning and skill acquisition. Dissemination of information and skills is via lectures, activities, practical workshops and group discussion. It is an excellent opportunity for therapists to share their knowledge, skills, ideas and have a forum to troubleshoot difficult aspects of lymphoedema management.

Participants are required to have 100% attendance throughout the face-to-face component.



Assignments

The assignments are evidence of your clinical reasoning for your chosen case study. The assessment part of the case studies will be discussed as part of a virtual session. The second assignment allows the learner to reflect on both the virtual sessions and face to face days and make changes, if required.
